Conc Area 1050 Ref Sheet 7F	14 Aug (Contd)		made a trip back to Bde H.Q. to find out the situation. It was rep to the C.O. that Major E.G.Styffe, C Coy Comd, had suffered severe wounds at ROUVEUS and was feared killed.	<i>asa</i>
.103 in square 1645	15 Aug 44		At 0630 hrs "A" Coy, under Major H.G.Dawson, moved with the 21 CAR to EPANCY and took the village, finding some opposition. "B" Coy remained at .115 with the 22 CAR. At noon, Bn HQ and "C" Coy moved to area OLENDON 166433 to await further orders. The area was shelled at 1400 hrs but there were no cas. Spasmodic 88mm A.P. came over the village but no vehicles were hit. At 1600 hrs the C.O. was about to move forward with his HQ but because of the fact that communications were so poor and he could get no infm as to the progress of the armour, he decided against it. "A" Coy received notice that the RAF was going to do some heavy bombing and that they were to move 20 minutes by vehicle from their present posn. Orders were given to proceed to our former harbour area; these changed enroute-- half the coy went to the old area while the remainder moved to new area near Olendon. Lt. A.G.Ferguson and part of Scout pl were sent to lead the remainder of the coy to Olendon. As the sec moved north on the road from Olendon, our fighter aircraft were seen diving on one of our columns. Two ammo trucks were set ablaze. A wide detour was necessary to escape the terrific shrapnel from exploding shells. As the sec completed the detour a fighter dived again towards them. Ground action was quickly adopted and a stick of bombs fell about 50 yds to our front. This was the third time our tps had been subjected to this. Every means of grd to air recognition was used, but it did not stop them. At 1900 hrs the C.O. recalled "A" & "B" Coys and 10 CIB took over their area. The C.O. then went to Bde to receive orders for the following day. There was considerable enemy air activity during the night. Flares were dropped, but none in the immediate area of the Bn.	<i>asa</i>
OLENDON 164443 Sh 7F/4	16 Aug 44		The C.O., Lt-Col. R.A.Keane, returned from Bde HQ at 0030 hrs with the orders for the new attack. He had previously sent guides back to the three coys who moved to the areas of the Armd Regts and were u/c of them. However the Regt was taken out of the line this morning for a short regrouping and to prepare for the next phase in the battle for Falaise. Lt. D.A.Johnson, I.O., has gone to Bde to replace Capt. H. MacKenzie, Bde I.O. Lt. A.G.Ferguson, "A" Coy, is to replace Lt. Johnson as Bn I.O. At 1230 hrs Bn began moving to an assembly area at MR 153437 and
